Winter Encampment Gear List for Feb. 12-14, 2010

Gear List:

- Full utilities w/ belt (no ribbons)
- Boots (if Uniform boots are not winter boots substitute winter boots. Black or dark Brown)
- Watch Cap(black knit or fleece)
- 2 Canteens w/ belt or hydration system(be advised hydration systems had a tendency to freeze last year.)
- Skivy drawers (3 sets)
- Red National T-shirt
- Underwear cold weather gear(i.e. long johns, under armour)(1-2 pairs)
- Boot Socks(6 pair)
- PT Gear(sweats) (2pair)
- Field jacket/Gortex (Heavy winter coat preferably black or OD green)
- Winter Gloves/Waterproofed if possible(Black)
- Rain Gear
- Hygiene Kit: Soap,shampoo,toothbrush,toothpaste,deodorant,etc. as needed
- Towel
- Sleeping Bag(rated to temp in the teens)
- Alice Pack(ruck, molle,etc.)
- Note taking gear
- Flashlight w/extra batteries
- Trashbags or Ziploc bags for waterproofing
- Medication must be in a ziplock bag with child's name and in the prescribed container with dosage instructions.

Want to get promoted from a PVT to a PFC? Here's how!

In order to obtain the rank of PFC, you must have the following signed off in your Basic Guide Books. CO, SGT Ridgeway, and YM 1stSgt are available before and after drill to sign off for you.

PO1: EO5, EO6, EO7, EO8, EO9

PO2: EO1b-d, EO4b-c, EO6c-d, EO8b

PO3: EO1a, EO2, EO9, EO10, EO11

PO4: EO1

PO5: EO1a

PO7: EO2

PO8: EO1, EO2

PO9: EO3, EO4, EO5d-e
